

July 4th parade in Havre de Grace will be held on July 3rd and will once again present our Post to the public. Your participation makes a difference.

The American Legion Legacy Run will begin on August 20 when hundreds of riders gather at the Indiana American Legion Post 64 for a safety training session and a dinner. The Run takes to the road the next day at The American Legion National Headquarters in Indianapolis, Indiana. It ends on August 25th at the National Convention in Cincinnati, Ohio. Now, should you look at a map, you might ask why does it take 5 days to go a whopping 100 miles. Well, they are going to take the long way around.

The run will pass through seven states (Indiana, Kentucky, Tennessee, Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia and Ohio) and traverse about 1300 miles before arriving for lunch at the Yeager-Benson Memorial American Legion Post 199 in Harrison, Ohio. Over the next few days several Ohio chapters will host events, meals, and runs for those riders who choose to stay for the National Convention Parade on the 28th. This whole undertaking is very complex and highly organized. Last year, the total monies raised for the Legacy Foundation was over \$1.25 million.

Starting in 2017, the Legacy Scholarship is expanding to cover not only the children of our fallen comrades, but also the children of post-9/11 veterans with a VA disability rating of 50 percent or higher. It will be a needs based grant and will award up to \$20,000 in aid for the expense of tuition, books, room and board, meal plans, transportation and other supplies needed to achieve a higher education that can be renewed up to six times.

We invite all of our American Legion family members that Ride a motorcycle (two or three wheels) with and engine displacement of at least 600cc's to join us. Best wishes and stay safe.
