Greetings Legionnaires, American Legion Auxiliary (ALA), Sons of the American Legion (SAL), American Legion Riders (ALR), and family members. As we look forward to 2017, I would like to thank everyone who has helped to make Bernard L. Tobin a post where everyone is welcome.

We are well on our way to meeting our membership goal of 100% for 2017, and as of 20 February 2017 we are over 76% for the year. That being said, we are still hoping to exceed our membership goal by reaching over 500 members in 2017. However, this cannot be accomplished without your support. If you know of any member that has not renewed their membership, please remind them to do so.

Our post is one of the pillars of our community. Here we teach children to respect the U.S. flag and provide color guards and escorts for funerals and community events. We sponsor Little League baseball, Boy Scout and Cub Scout troops and have connected with veterans and their families by providing Temporary Financial Assistance (TFA) in difficult times.

We at The American Legion are vital in the effort to continue serving our veterans. Our camaraderie and array of programs are second to none; however, if we don't continue to grow our membership, the Legion's influence will be greatly diminished. A smaller Legion means a smaller veteran footprint within our community. A smaller footprint reduces the opportunity to provide mentorship for our youth about worthy values, citizenship, and patriotism. It also diminishes our ability to provide assistance to our veterans.

Before the Gulf War, 9/11, and wars in Afghanistan and Iraq, our Legion membership was 3,013,189 strong. However, since this time our membership has declined. This is why we must make it our mission to sign up every eligible veteran we can reach – not necessarily for reward or recognition, but because they've earned the privilege to be part of our family.

My challenge to every Legion, Auxiliary, and SAL member is to recruit one new member this year. It's up to us to leave our Legion bigger and better than we found it, and to hand its great responsibility and purpose off to a new generation that, first and foremost, must be asked to join.

This is as simple as asking people you know or striking up a conversion with someone you see wearing military uniform or apparel. The American Legion's success depends entirely on active membership, participation and volunteerism. Our organization belongs to the people it serves and the communities in which it thrives. Your membership gives you and your family practical discounts that can easily save you many times the cost of your annual membership dues. Your membership helps support Department Service Officers nationwide who assist veterans in preparing claims and obtaining their full military healthcare benefits through the VA.



Post 128 attends a sendoff for America's heroes

On Sunday, January 29th, 2017, nearly 200 Maryland Army National Guard members tearfully said goodbye to their loved ones as they prepared for a nine-month deployment to the Middle East. And standing side-by-side with them were American Legion Family members who came to show their support and provide reassurance that The American Legion will meet the needs of their families during their deployment and upon their return home.

For many of the soldiers and their families, it's their second deployment with the 29th Combat Aviation Brigade since 2012, then under the command of Col. Dave Carey, a member of Post 39.

"We leaned on the Legion on our past deployment for the departing and returning ceremony. The Legion being there this time, they really stepped up and said, 'We are behind you all the way and if your family has problems while you're gone here's how to reach us,'" Carey said.

But for other soldiers of the unit, it's their first deployment and not only are families being left behind, but civilian jobs as

well. That's why the Legion's presence at the deployment ceremony was a reminder to all that "The American Legion as a whole will be there for their families through our Family Support Network", said David Johnson, a Past Aberdeen Post 128 Commander. "The American Legion wants to help the ones deploying stay focused on their mission and stay safe."



"By me being there with my wife (Debra) and my fellow Legionnaires, I felt that it allowed me to let them know that 'Hey, we've been there, we know what you're going through, and we're here for you and your family,'" said David Heredia, a Legion Rider and 1st Vice Commander of Post 128 in Aberdeen. "We let them know that the American Legion is here to support not only them but their families."



"It was sad that these soldiers are going to be missing their families, but on a positive note, I saw the community come out to support these soldiers, including their employers," said Debra Heredia, a member of Aberdeen Auxiliary Unit 128." It was such an inspiring experience to see these soldiers, who have given their time and their commitment and basically are allowing their lives to be risked to make sure the rest of us Americans, who are here back at home, are safe.

"It's nice for them to know that others have been where they are and are willing to come out and continue to support them. And to remind them if they need a family support group, American Legion posts are everywhere."
