Community and our family of the American Legion. We are a unique group of women who love our country and I know if we work together as a team we will accomplish great things.

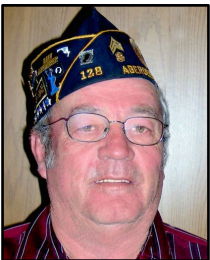
