## Message from American Legion Riders



I would like to start out by announcing the newly installed Officers of The American Legion Bernard L. Tobin Post 128 Legion Riders: Director: Richard Beckwell, Assistant Director: David Heredia, Secretary: Deborah Heredia, Treasurer: Susan Beckwell, and Sgt-at-Arms: Richard Davis

With that being done, it was suggested to me that I should use this space to let my fellow Legion family members know what we Riders have been up to over the last Legion year.

Veterans: We supported two funerals as escorts, two veteran Honor Bus escorts, and the Memorial Day Gold Star dinner which was part of the Rolling Thunder activities. In addition, we participated in the Maryland Public Television's LZ Maryland honor ride that honored the veterans from the Viet Nam era as well as the 1017 Marylanders who were either killed or listed as MIA.

Children and Youth: Last year we supported the Post's "Shop

With a Cop" program with a poker run and fund solicitations. The program was able to support 9 families and 19 children. The American Legion Legacy Fund is near and dear to the Riders. As a result, we have many activities throughout the year in the Department to raise money. We attend some functions as participants, and in some, we take a more active role. Last year several of our members participated in the Legacy Scholarship Run that started in Indianapolis, Indiana, traveled over 1300 miles and ended in Baltimore. The total funds raised were in excess of \$1.25 million. To assist in raising that number this year, a group of riders, from several chapters (including David Heredia, the Assistant Director here) formed a committee to organize the first "Maryland Gold Star Legacy Run". This run was conducted on June 10, 11, and 12, 2016, took three days and covered nearly 800 miles. To date, that effort has raised over \$13,000 with more coming in. In addition, a special "Gold Star" coin was designed and procured by David Heredia that was sold during this period as a fund raiser with all proceeds going to the Legacy Scholarship Fund.

As I stated above, last year's Legacy Scholarship Run ended in Baltimore on a Wednesday and many riders wanted to remain for the Parade that was to be held on Sunday. What to do? Several Riders organized activities to keep them occupied. Three rides were put together and over the next three days were conducted: Thursday, a "Maryland Covered Bridges" ride; Friday, a run to Ft. McHenry (David Heredia as the lead); Saturday, a ride to see the monuments in D.C. On Sunday, the Legion Riders led the National American Legion Convention Parade in Baltimore.

Community: Last year we were partners with the Aberdeen Chamber of Commerce, Rotary and Lions Clubs. to orchestrate the "Paint the Town Pink" 5k run. The riders had a Poker Run to bring Cancer Awareness as well as garner funds for Upper Chesapeake Health Foundation.
